Summary

- Provide individual, group therapy and case management services to at-risk youth and adults within homes. at schools, and in the community
- Participate in the inter-disciplinary clinical team with OTRs and COTAs in the development of individual treatment plans, goals and discharge plans for the clients
- · Collaborate with family, teachers, probation officers, care givers in the community as part of the treatment team
- Complete all documentation within the standards of the Department of Mental Health in a timely manner
- · Attend all monthly staff meetings
- Participate in the crisis line phone rotation.
- · Work on other appropriate tasks as assigned by the supervisor
- Driving is a required aspect of the job (for example: must drive to multiple field sites)
- · Regular attendance required
- Other duties, as needed
- Will become trained and certified in Seeking Safety evidence-based treatment.
- Provide screening for participant eligibility and enrollment.
